Data collected is consolidated and a report is prepared. Data entered in the feedback forms are then analysed and suggestions/feedback given by the stakeholders is given due attention.


1. Student Feedback-


I .Courses, Syllabi and Subject Evaluation and Teacher


Student feedback helps to evaluate and improve teaching effectiveness. It allows the students to become more engaged and involved in the College. All the students expressed their satisfaction with the course organisation, syllabus coverage, and evaluation process. Majority of them agreed that there is thrust on application of concepts learnt, content is covered from zero to advanced level, and sufficient study material is available. The analysis further revealed that most of the students think that the faculty communicates effectively, comes well prepared to the class, encourages participation and discussion in the class, uses teaching aids, and their attitude towards students is helpful and friendly. Few of them feel that practice through assignments need to be encouraged.






































(ii) Institution Infrastructure

In this section of the feedback form, the institutional infrastructure is assessed. Most of the students believe that laboratories are well equipped and sufficient basic amenities are available in the College. The analysis points out that the majority of the students are satisfied with infrastructural facilities of the Medical Room (Bhai Kanhaiya Health Centre), Girls Common Room, Hostel, Canteen, and Mess. Although few of them feel that the infrastructure of these facilities need upgradation.








(i) Administration






iv) Foreign Students




2. Teacher Feedback




4. Alumni Feedback



















Conclusion:- The survey responses were collected from the alumni at the annual alumni meet




4. Parents Feedback


Parent's feedback helps in giving useful insights to improve the teaching learning experience and infrastructural facilities. Therefore the College collects feedback from parents regularly. The analysis of feedback collected revealed that more than eighty nine percent of parents are satisfied and happy with the facilities provided to their wards in the College. Ninety two percent of them feel that their wards are comfortable and physically secured in the College. Eighty five percent of parents are satisfied with cooperation which they get from the administrative staff. More than eighty six percent of parents feel that they can easily approach the faculty. Eighty four percent of parents feel delighted that the institution catered to the personality development of their children by the up-gradation of both hard and soft skills. The analysis further revealed that about fourteen percent of the parents feel that hostel facilities need to be improved and fifteen percent of them expect better cooperation from the administrative staff and up gradation in hard and soft skills of their wards.
