## UTILIZATION OF RUSA GRANT

### **CATEGORY: NEW CONSTRUCTION**

**Sanctioned Amount: Rs. 70 Lakhs**

**Amount Spent: Rs. 69.63 Lakhs**

- The Sri Guru Gobind Singh College has been a formidable reputation in the field of sports and have won the prestigious Sir Shadi Lal Trophy consecutively for over a decade. The RUSA Infrastructural grant has allowed the college to further enhance the quality of sports infrastructure. The state-of-art basket-ball and lawn tennis courts have been constructed by utilizing the RUSA Infrastructural Grant. It aims to facilitate excellence and performance in sports by improvement of quality. The addition of these newly constructed courts to the existing sports infrastructure will further boost the capability of the college to produce remarkable sports persons.



- The two classrooms has also been constructed from the RUSA Infrastructural Grant. These will add to the already existing infrastructure and will cater to growth in terms of course addition as well the rise in the number of student

enrolments.



***CATEGORY : RENOVATION/UPGRADATION***

***Sanctioned Amount; Rs 70 Lakhs***

***Amount Spent: Rs 69.97 Lakhs***

An amount of Rs. 70 Lakhs was assigned for the Renovation/Upgradation under the RUSA Infrastructural Grant. The financial assistance by RUSA under this category was used to renovate and upgrade the already existing resources/infrastructure of the college.

- Significant and rapid makeover has been accomplished resulting in the strengthening of infrastructure, multimedia and physical facilities, especially in library, science laboratories, conference/meeting halls amongst various sites of the college.



- Renovation of various furniture items; repair and maintenance of lab equipment, installation of blinds in Library, Computer Lab, Principal Office; POP, White-Wash and Wallpaper in Library have been undertaken.

- Furthermore, wall mounted storage cabinets were installed in the Chemistry and Zoology departments. Procurement of water cooler, sanitary napkin vending machine has been done as a part of continuous and regular upgradation of basic student amenities.
- Fencing of the outer boundary wall of the college has also been undertaken using the RUSA grant to further secure the periphery of the Sri Guru Gobind Singh College campus. The safety and security of an educational institute is of utmost importance and vital for the peaceful learning environment.



- The Bhai Kahan Singh Nabha Library of the college is upgraded further with the procurement of two linear modular workstations (four seater) and Ten All in One Desktops (Core i7-7700) as part of Refurbishment and Digitization of library.



The financial assistance from RUSA has a significant role in the rapid and remarkable transformation of the library.

- Various Science Labs and staff-rooms were refurbished by changing the floor tiles to give a modern and clean outlook. These labs can be utilized by both students and faculty to further their academic and research interests



Quality ambience is of vital importance in sustaining the interest of various stakeholders in the pursuit of knowledge.

- There has been surge in use of multimedia within the education sector as a tool of educational technology in recent years and is likely to stay in the future. Teachers primarily require access to these learning resources, which can augment concept development to meet individual learning needs. The development of multimedia technologies for learning offers new ways in which learning can take place. In the wake of such demand, RUSA grant has been utilized to upgrade the multimedia facilities. It has been realized with help of procurement of two touchscreen HD-LED Interactive Display equipment (4K), smart digital podium (01), multimedia projectors (02).
- These will be used in various conference/meeting halls in the SGGS College campus. Furthermore, eight interactive smart boards have been procured in order to upgrade the existing classrooms and laboratories as per the demands evolving in the education system during this era of information technology.



- These smart classrooms and laboratories play significant role in catering the needs of stakeholders and enrich the teaching and learning experience.

**CATEGORY: EQUIPMENT**

**Sanctioned Amount: Rs. 60 Lakhs.**

**Spent Amount : Rs. 59.95 Lakhs.**

A total of Rupees 60 Lac/- allocated for equipment head under the RUSA infrastructural grant have been utilized primarily to accounts for the needs of teaching, learning and administrative stakeholders in the age of computers and technology.

- The purchase of SLIM21 Library Management Software will be instrumental in Library Automation.

- Gatta Cutting Machine is also procured for the library as per the requirement.



- The power backup requirement of Computer Science and Biotech departments for the labs have been met by purchasing of two 10 kVA UPS from the RUSA equipment grant.
- Latest Lab equipment/apparatus for the various laboratories of the respective departments of Chemistry, Physics and Life Sciences (Zoology and Botany) have been procured to meet the continuously evolving demands of the practical teaching and learning methods. The lab equipment is the backbone of the science teaching and provide for learning by doing.
  - Science lab equipment allows students to interact directly with the data gathered. They get a first-hand learning experience by performing various experiments.
  - The procurement under RUSA has also helped the respective labs to evolve as per the needs of the latest syllabi and replacement of outdated apparatus.
  - Some of the lab equipment purchased with the RUSA grant includes various types of microscopes, magnetic stirrers, fume-hoods, muffle



furnace, single stage vacuum pump, digital water-baths, laminar airflow, bacteriological incubator, microwave oven ,electrophoresis unit, autoclave sterilizers, micro-centrifuge, conductivity meters, Hall effect setup, Geiger-Muller counter setup, CROs, digital Oscilloscopes, digital Multimeters, high precision weighing balances, electronic characteristics kits , He-Ne laser , Fresnel Biprism setup etc.



Two HD-LED Televisions have been procured to aid surveillance and visualization of the real time video output from the CCTV cameras installed in the college campus.

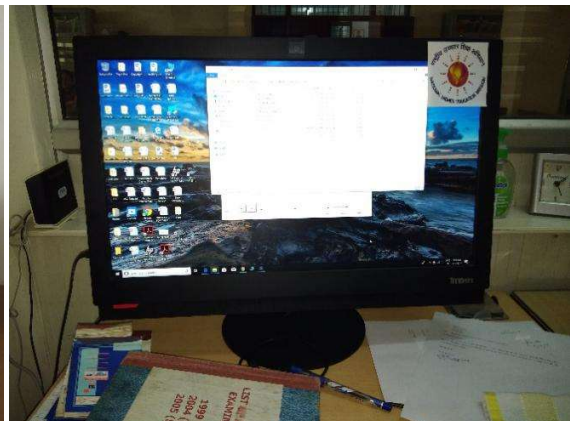
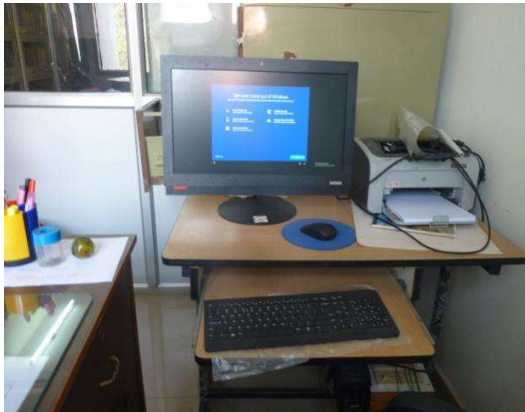


- To account for the professional work pertaining to record keeping and other administrative work, one Multifunction photocopier, ten printers, four MFPs, two ink-tank printers, three scanners have been procured to fulfill the requirements of various offices in the college.



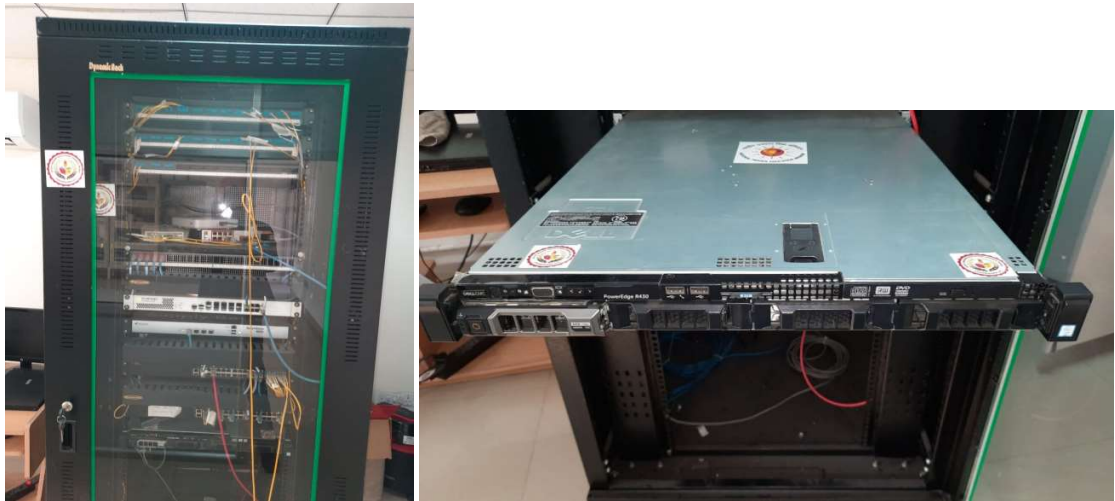
- Thirty All-in-One computers and three laptops have also been purchased under equipment section of RUSA Infrastructural grant and allocated to various heads

and office-in-charges to aid teaching/administrative work. These tools greatly enhance the efficiency and quality of the day-to-day work, help in better record keeping and communication amongst the co-workers. These procurements have brought a remarkable change in the working of these offices.



- In addition, five more desktop computers have been recently added to account for the enhanced online/computer work during the Covid-19 situation.

- Furthermore, server has been procured and installed under the supervision of system manager for the purpose of Wi-Fi upgradation, automation and data management.



- To facilitate comfortable seating for the faculty, thirty office chairs were procured.
- In order to aid the cleaning and maintain tidiness floor scrubber cleaner machine, vacuum cleaner, napkin incinerator have been bought from the financial assistance provided by RUSA.



## SUMMARY

The Sri Guru Gobind Singh College, Sector-26, Chandigarh has received the RUSA Infrastructural grant amounting to Rs 2 crore/-. The financial grant received from RUSA have aided the college to significantly pace up the new constructions, procurement of equipment, renovation and upgradation work of the infrastructure. Summary of some major works carried out with the help of financial assistance as per the Government of India, MHRD guidelines are as below:

1. Construction of new basketball and lawn-tennis courts in the campus.
2. Construction of two new classrooms
3. Renovation and upgradation of Library.
4. Digitization of Library.
5. Renovation of laboratories and staff-rooms in Department of Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Botany and Library.
6. Strengthening of IT facilities in all the Departments and administrative offices.
7. Procurement of equipment in Department of Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Botany and Library.
8. Fabrication and installation of MS grill fencing on the outer boundary wall of the college.
9. Upgradation of multimedia facilities.
10. Procurement of equipment for cleaning/sanitation purpose.
11. Addition of basic amenities.

The RUSA aid has helped in the improvement in overall infrastructure and enhancement of capacity of the college. It has resulted in major campus upgradation and improvement in techniques for imparting education. The multimedia tools have enriched and expanded the mode of teaching. The addition of these tools in conjunction with traditional methods provides impetus to the teaching-learning process. It has resulted in updation of technical and IT skills of both students as well as teachers, which came particularly handy during the Covid-19. The process of imparting quality education has been given a boost by the accumulation of necessary equipment and tools under the aegis

of RUSA. Renovation and digitization of Kahan Singh Nabha Library has aided the enrichment of learning resources as per the present scenario. The sports infrastructure of the college was further augmented through construction of basketball and lawn-tennis court. Strengthening of IT facilities was particularly useful in smooth function of various offices and timely execution of administrative duties. The other record keeping and data preservation capability is also enhanced with procurement of computers, scanner and printers. The accessibility to gain information has also improved. The campus has benefited from various procurement and upgradation/renovation projects. The safety and security procedures have been made further effective through fencing and installation of visual display of CCTV data.

## **FEEDBACK**

The feedback received from various stakeholders has been appreciative of the changes and transformation of the college infrastructure and facilities supported by the financial assistance from RUSA infrastructural grant. The improved IT infrastructure has helped in better coordination and communication amongst teaching as well as non-teaching staff. The positive feedback from students is indicative of the benefits of the new laboratory apparatus and upgradation of labs. Both teachers and students have shown enthusiasm due to addition of multimedia technology in the classrooms and laboratories. The improved ambience and seating facilities in various staff-rooms has been appreciated by the faculty. The makeover of college library, its upgradation and digitization has also been well received by all stakeholders/visitors.

## Preservi Nanak with science and music

**CHANDIGARH:** Traditional Sikh instruments were displayed during a workshop on digital transformation and preservation called 'Mama never miss' (I'll be remembered, wisdom, knowledge), commemorating the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev, here at Sri Guru Gobind Singh College, Sector 26, on Tuesday.

Some of the instruments were handed over by Bhai Baldeep Singh, who is the 10th generation vocalist exponent of gurbani sagun, and then, faculty of humanities and religious studies, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.
