GUIDELINES FOR AUTHOR(S)

Submission of Abstract

Authors are requested to adhere to the following guidelines to facilitate the submission process:

The abstract must be concise (250-300 words) along with upto 06 keywords and clearly outline the research problem, purpose of the study, methodology used and key findings/contributions. The abstract must be written clearly in English language, should be typed in Times New Roman, 14-point (Title), 12-point (Text), 1.5 inch line spacing, justified alignment and one inch margin on all sides. The abstract should include paper title, author's name(s), contact number, e-mail ID, and institutional affiliation with complete address (organization, city, state, and country). Submissions must be in Microsoft Word (.doc/.docx) format. Accepted Abstracts will be presented in oral sessions through Offline Mode and will be published in the Seminar Souvenir. Posters must be prepared on A2 size Chart Paper (16.5 X 23.5 inches) only. The registration is mandatory for all attendees.

Format for Full Paper

The title page should be attached, containing the paper title, author's name(s), contact number, e-mail ID, and institutional affiliation with complete address (organization, city, state, and country). The full length paper should not exceed 4500 words (including abstract, references, tables and figures). The paper should be typed in Times New Roman, 14-point (Title), 12-point (Text), 1.5 inch line spacing, justified alignment and one inch margin on all sides. Pages should be numbered consecutively. The paper must include abstracts, introduction, objectives, methods, results, discussions, conclusion and references. The paper must follow the guidelines of APA 7th ed citation style. All submitted papers will undergo a Peer-Review Process to ensure high-quality content. All submissions must be original and unpublished works by the author(s).

Plagiarism

Submissions with plagiarism exceeding 10% is not acceptable. Plagiarism will be checked using DrillBit or Turnitin software. The use of generative AI tools in research paper / article writing is discouraged.

Publication

Selected full papers will be published in reputed journal and an edited volume with ISBN by a reputed publisher. The Editorial Board will make the final publication decisions. Notification of acceptance will be communicated to the authors after the review process. Publication cost will be exclusive of Registration Fee.



BEST PAPER AWARD AND APPRECIATION

The best paper award and appreciation certificate will be presented to the author for the best oral presentation at each technical session of the Seminar.



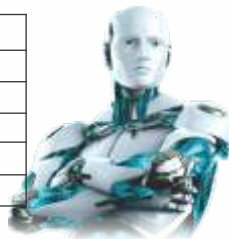
