The Library is housed on two floors and the existing resources are upgraded every year. The library has an exclusive section for the Postgraduate Departments. A broadband Internet facility is also available for the faculty.

The College Library uses SLIM21, a user-friendly software for library automation. WEBOPAC [Online Public Access Catalogue] is available to facilitate online access to the library collection. N-List, DELNET (Developing Library Network) and National Digital Library of India (NDLI) databases are accessible to faculty members and students. 10 computers with Internet facilities have been allocated to the faculty members for easy access to electronic resources and databases. The special collection of the library includes old Result Gazettes of PU Exams, Newspaper clipping service, Employment Alerts and a Book Bank. PU Question Papers, PU Syllabus, e-lectures contributed by faculty members and newspaper clippings of all the events covered by the College Media Cell are uploaded and updated regularly on Bhai Kahan Singh Nabha Library Blog for swift access of proof and record of all college activities carried out throughout the year.

**Book Bank facility** has been created for the students belonging to economically weaker families. The faculty members and students donate old and unused subject books. Currently, the library has a collection of 2259 books in the Book Bank.

**Helen Keller' Braille Section:** A separate Braille section has been established in the College library for visually impaired users with a unique facility of Lex Instant Reader and Scanner software, designed for quick and easy reading of digital documents. With a scanning speed of 20 pages per minute, it comes with 10 vocalizer voices including Indian Voice Sangeeta.

## College Hostel

The College has an on-campus Baba Banda Singh Bahadur Boy's Hostel having 73 rooms with accommodation for around 275 students. The Warden Office, Waiting Room, Mess and facilities like a separate Study Room, Fitness Centre, Indoor Games, Guest Room and LCD TV are available. The Hostel is well equipped with amenities like water coolers, geysers, a generator set, Wi-Fi connectivity and fire extinguishers. CCTV cameras have been installed at specific points to keep strict vigilance. **Mr Amrik Singh** (PG Deptt of Punjabi) is the Hostel Warden assisted by **Mr Amrinder Singh** (PG Deptt of Biotechnology & Microbial Biotechnology).

Accommodation for girl students is provided in the Girls Hostel with 138 rooms of Guru Gobind Singh College for Women situated in the SGGS campus. 57 Girls students of the College were accommodated in the Hostel in 2021-22. **Dr Saroj Bala** (PG Deptt of Physics) is the Hostel In-charge.



## Guru Nanak Sacred Forest – A Mini Urban Forest

Sri Guru Gobind Singh College initiated a novel idea of creating Guru Nanak Sacred Forest - A Mini Urban Forest with native species (GNSF) on Campus in April 2019 with an objective to promote a sustainable environment. This habitation has now flourished into a natural air-purifying dense forest with 550 trees comprising 37 different native species of the region planted in an area of 180 square metres. With the creation of the mini-urban forest, the College has made a niche in the field of environment sustainability, biodiversity conservation and preservation of genetic heritage. This tiny forest space is acting as a safe refuge for insects, birds and other fauna that are gradually disappearing from the ecosystem and is a major step in reducing the Carbon Footprint of the region.

**Balihari Kudrat Healing Herbs Garden** is a designated area in the mini urban forest to plant sacred herbs.

The Sacred Forest amalgamates the aspects of ecosystem diversity, curative diversity (a wide variety of medicinal plants) and cultural diversity (including spiritual values) very successfully.

The Air Quality Index is installed on the outer wall of Guru Nanak Sacred Forest to report the Air quality daily. The AQI parameters reported are quite satisfactory due to the green cover.

- Wildlife Week was celebrated by planting trees of Sweet Tamarind (Tamarindus indica) on Campus. Dr Navjot Kaur, Principal planted the first sapling at Sports Ground on Campus. The event was attended by 16 participants.

The Competition included four events spread over the span of a week. About 30 colleges from all over Punjab and adjoining areas participated.

The College is proud of its 03 NSS Units comprising more than 300 volunteers who participate wholeheartedly in various activities undertaken to generate a sense of social responsibility. Activities conducted by the NSS Units of the College during the session 2021-22 were:

#### 07-Day Special NSS Camp:

07-Day Special NSS Camp was organised on the theme 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and Jal Shakti Abhiyan' from Mar 04-10, 2022. A total of 128 participants (117 students and 11 non-students) participated in this camp.

**Day 01:** Volunteers were instructed about social distancing, hand sanitization protocols and the functioning of the camp. Mr Pawan and Ms Pooja, experts from the Chandigarh Police Team, demonstrated several self-defense practices in the Self-Defence Training Session.

Second Guest Speaker, Mohd Amzad, spoke about the work he has been doing as an NSS volunteer, and how the same helped him bag the Best NSS Volunteer (National) Award. Day concluded with Guest Lectures by Dr Sugandha Kohli Kaang, Coordinator, Dharat Suhavi Environment Society, SGGS College informing the students about the initiatives taken by the College for collecting e-waste on Campus. and Dr Harsimran Kaur Aulakh, Coordinator, Solid Waste Management Committee, SGGS College talking about the growing menace of Wet, Dry, Industrial and Electronic waste and the need for effective waste management. in her lecture on 'Solid Waste Management: Make Our Planet A Cleaner Place to Live'.

**Day 02:** A lecture on Eye Donation was delivered by Dr Suresh Kumar Arya, Prof and Head, Cornea, Eye Bank and Refractive Surgery, Deptt of Ophthalmology, Govt Medical College and Hospital, Sec 32, Chd, in collaboration with Equal Opportunity Cell of the College. Mr Jagannath Singh Jayara, Principal, Institute for the Blind, Sec-26, Chd also spoke on the significance of eye donation.



In the concluding session, ASI Rajinder Singh, ASI Bhupinder Singh and Sr Const Rajiv Kumar from Chandigarh Traffic Police delivered a lecture on Road Safety and Traffic Rules. An hour-long Cleanliness Drive was conducted.

In the second half of the day, a Nature Trail in the GNSF mini-urban forest on Campus was organised in collaboration with the Guru Nanak Sacred Forest Committee and Baaz Birdwatchers' Society of the College.
