

Sikh Educational Society - A Great Legacy



Iconic Sikh National College, Lahore, 1938

The Sikh Educational Society established in 1936 at Lahore ventured into the realm of higher education with the establishment of Sikh National College at Lahore in the year 1937-38. The ideological inputs of eminent educationists like Principal Niranjn Singh and Principal Bawa Harkishan Singh fructified with the socio-political lead given by eminent Sikh leaders like Master Tara Singh, Giani Kartar Singh, S Mangal Singh, which culminated into establishment of the iconic Sikh National College at the historic Sikh Shrine of Buddha ka Awa at Lahore. Tiding over the vicissitudes of the Partition of Punjab, the progressive Sikh leaders re-established the Sikh National College at Qadian, Punjab in the area vacated by the Ahmedias in 1948. It was followed by the establishment of Sikh National College Banga in the year 1953. At present the Sikh Educational Society is playing a pivotal role in imparting education to all sections of society through the educational institutions spread all over the Region. Established in 1966, Sri Guru Gobind Singh College, Sector-26, Chandigarh is a Premier Institute of Higher Education under the stewardship of the Sikh Educational Society.

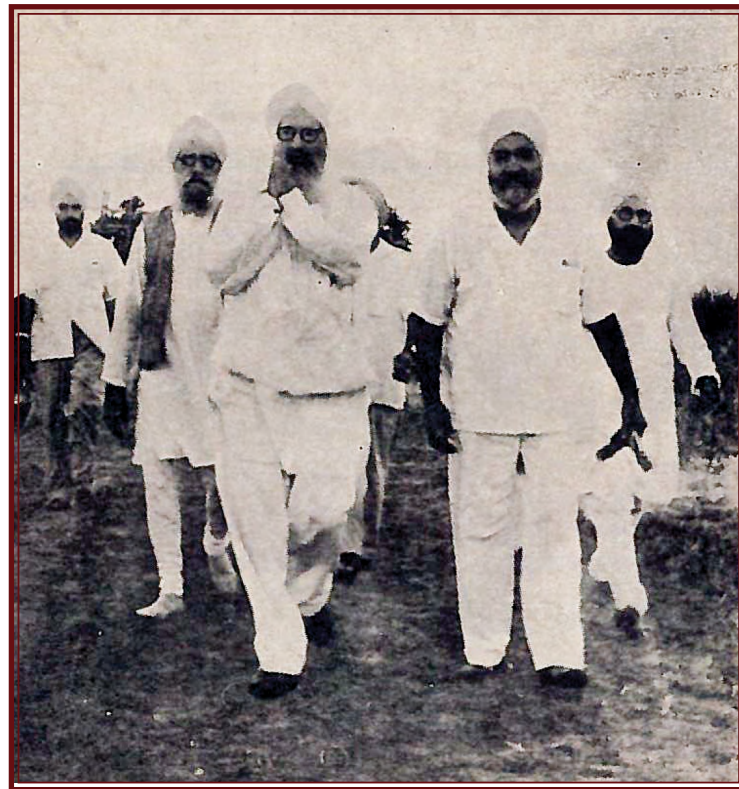

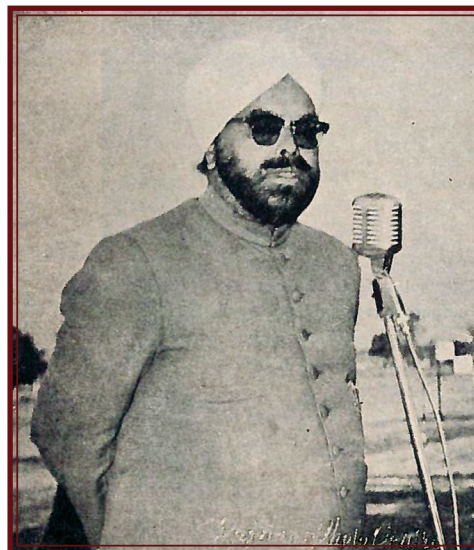

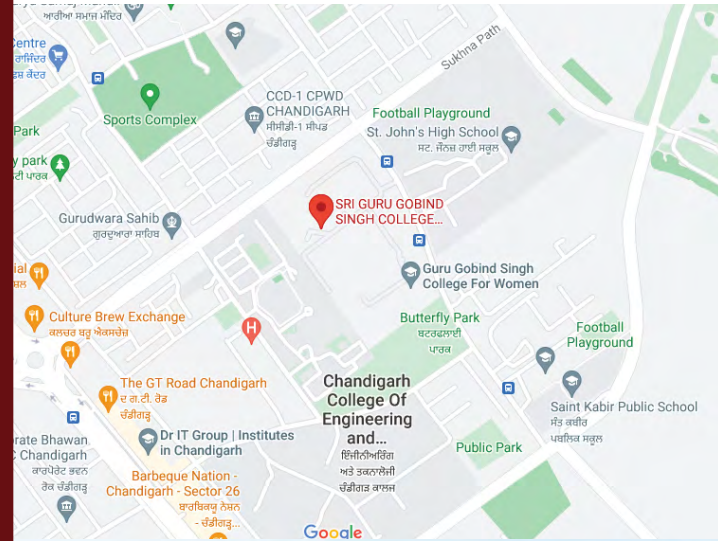

Baba Banda Singh Bahadur Boys' Hostel

The College has on-campus Boys Hostel having AC and Non-AC rooms with an accommodation for around 300 students. Facilities like Waiting Room, Mess, separate Study Room, Fitness Centre, Activity Room equipped with Snooker Table, Table Tennis and Chess, Guest Room and Recreational Room having TV and Newspapers are available. All necessary furniture like chair, study table, bed (excluding bedding) and cupboard are provided in each room. The Hostel is well equipped with amenities like water coolers, geysers, a generator set, Wi-Fi connectivity and fire extinguishers. CCTV cameras have been strategically installed to ensure strict surveillance and security.



Medical Facility : Bhai Kanhaiya Health Centre

A consulting Physician assisted by a pharmacist and lab technician is available for students and faculty members in the campus for free consultation on all working days. For emergency, students and faculty are trained for First Aid Course by St John (India), Indian Red Cross Society.

Best Practice: Environmental Sustainability



- Environmental sustainability is a key pillar of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, G20, Y20 and B20 Agendas, National Educational Policy 2020 aiming to ensure a healthy planet for current and future generations. Keeping the same goal in mind, the Best Practice of Environmental Sustainability promoted by Sri Guru Gobind Singh College, Sector 26, Chandigarh incorporates traditional and modern techniques for the preservation of natural resources and protection of the ecosystem.
- The College has created a Guru Nanak Sacred Forest-A Mini Urban Forest with Native Species, an unprecedented and visionary undertaking established on campus in 2017 by students, academia and other stakeholders. It is an excellent example of community-led biodiversity conservation and preservation of genetic heritage. The Mini-Urban Forest is a thriving natural habitat, comprising 600 trees with 52 diverse native species spread across 180 square meters.
- An Observation and Research Centre in the forest area facilitates research by faculty and students on the potential of native species for Sustainable Development. Research projects sponsored by Department of Science and Technology and Department of Environment, Chandigarh Administration besides interdisciplinary research involving diverse domains like Literature, History, Religious studies, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Biotechnology. More than 50 research papers have been published so far.
- The Bahari Kudrat Healing and Sacred Herbs Garden within the Forest contributes to the scientific understanding of the ecosystem that integrates curative diversity through medicinal plants, cultural diversity and spiritual values.
- The installation of an Air Quality Index (AQI) in the Forest reflects the College's commitment to monitoring and maintaining environmental health.
- BAAZ Bird Watchers' Society is an innovative enterprise to research, observe, and archive information about different species of birds visiting the campus, by the students. The E-Bird Data is being gathered and organised with the help of the students. SGGSC participated in the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC), Bird-a-Thon(2024)organised by Cornell University and the Audubon Society, USA from 16/02/24 to 19/02/24. During this event 101 birds of 14 species were spotted and observed in the College campus.
- PAWS Humane Society for Animal Assisted Therapy is a unique, first of its kind initiative which aims to sensitise students about animal welfare, facilitate an environment of dignity and respect between

humans and animals and to promote compassion and empathy for all living beings. The PAWS Society of the College has adopted 10 stray dogs.

- The Barah Maha Garden of Biodiversity on campus involves a pilot study and plantation of flowering plants attracting birds, butterflies and honey bees.
- Various Campaigns, workshops, Nature Trails and events promoting awareness about environmental sustainability are organised in collaboration with Punjab Biodiversity Board (PBB), ENVIS Centre, Department of Environment, PSCST, Chandigarh Renewal Energy Science & Technology Promotion Society (CREST), Forest & Wildlife Preservation, Department of Soil & Water Conservation; Central Ground Water Board, Chandigarh & Punjab State Rural Development Board
- SGGSC College collaborates with other higher educational institutes, schools along with five adopted villages—Chaumajra, Durali, Gobindgarh, Manauli, and Tasoli to conduct impactful outreach initiatives
- The College has initiated an eco-friendly practice of Zero Litter Hour to be observed everyday by Faculty and students. The College also continually ensures the implementation of the 5R's: Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose and Recycle. The Zero

Food Wastage initiative has a significant impact in minimizing food waste and promoting responsible consumption in hostels, college cafeterias, and various events. Colour-coded dustbins are placed all across the campus for segregation of wet and dry waste. Leaf litter is accumulated in vermicomposting pits for biodegradation. Separate bins for plastic bottles have been installed. Milk bag recycling project initiated in the College also aims to reduce the impact of plastic waste on the environment.

- Flowers used for decoration at various occasions in College are collected and sent to the Sarwati Women's Self-Help Group, where they are recycled into incense sticks and candles
- Student Self Help Groups and Entrepreneurial Ventures of the College puts up stalls displaying Bio organic manure made from the horticultural waste in Botanical Garden of the College, Millet meals, Eco friendly pens and pencils on different occasions to promote sustainable practices among the stakeholders
- 3 Rain Water Harvesting units have been installed in the College. Solar power plants with capacity of more than 250kw are installed on the rooftop of College premises.

Best Practice: Heritage and Cultural Preservation

To train and sensitise the youth, the following initiatives are undertaken:

- Promoting Skill and Vocational Training which involves:
 - ▶▶ Collaboration with Mehar Baba Charitable Trust, Fatehgarh Sahib to empower rural women entrepreneurs in Phulkari craftsmanship
 - ▶▶ Providing Skill-based training to students in traditional arts and crafts like Phulkari and Cross-stitch, Pakhi-making, Folk Orchestra, Peerhi-making, Bagh, and Crochet
 - ▶▶ Training in Gurmukhi Calligraphy, Gurmat Studies, String Instruments (Rabab/Sarangi), Percussion Instruments (Jorhi/Tabla), Shabad Gayan, and provision of free Gurmat Sangeet classes and Gatka training for students
- Collaboration with Panjab Digital Library for Adopt a Book initiative, Creation of Heritage Walls on Campus, Exhibitions of selected and rare archival content on Punjabi heritage and culture, to make

students aware about diverse history, heritage, literature and culture

- Establishment of Virasat Heritage Centre, a museum depicting the life and teachings of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, after whom the College has been named and sections devoted to history of Sikh Educational Society to generate awareness about the legacy of the past and preserve it for future generations
- Promoting Punjabi Maa Boli (Mother Tongue), literature, and culture, which includes preserving, and maintaining the vibrancy of Mother Tongue by naming various buildings, gardens, and societies of the College with titles reflecting historical and cultural significance
- Innovative research which includes publishing several research papers, books, PhDs on topics of Heritage and Cultural Preservation
- SGGS Resource Centre for Heritage and Cultural Preservation was established to promote heritage and culture of various region among the students. Different activities are organized to train and develop their knowledge in this field.
- **The College organised Panjab University Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival 2023, on the theme 'One Earth-One Family-One Future', underlining the interconnectedness of humanity and our collective responsibility to forge a more sustainable and harmonious future for all.**

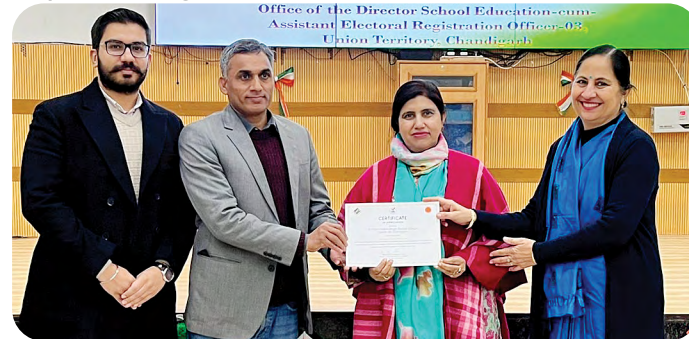

A total of 350 dignitaries were honoured with plants grown in the Botanical Garden of the College in 2022-23. The College won various prizes in flower competitions at Panjab University Rose Festival and Spring Festival.

The composting unit of the College produced 01 cycle of simple compost, 03 cycles of Bacterial compost and 03 cycles of Vermicompost which were used as manure for the College gardens.

The Society conducts outreach initiatives and awareness campaigns beyond the campus. Tree planting drives, waste management programs, and awareness campaigns on conservation practices are regularly organized in the five adopted villages.

The Eco Scouts actively engage and educate students from both the College and schools across the region about the project, fostering widespread participation and environmental awareness.

Waste Management Committee

Under Swachh Bharat Mission, the College is raising awareness and promoting waste management practices to create a zero-waste campus, promoting a cleaner and more sustainable environment. The College continually tries to ensure the implementation of the 5R's: Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose and Recycle. The key practices undertaken are:

- Campus waste is segregated at source and recycled or sold off to authorised vendors
- Zero Litter Hour is observed to inculcate cleanliness practices among students
- Zero Food Wastage initiative has a significant impact in minimizing food waste and promoting responsible consumption in the hostel, College cafeterias during various events
- Colour-coded Dustbins are placed all across the campus for segregation of wet and dry waste
- Wet waste generated in the College Mess and Canteen is collected by local pig farmers
- Leaf litter is accumulated in the simple, bacterial and vermicomposting pits for biodegradation
- Flowers used for decoration at various occasions in College are collected and sent to the Sarwati Women's Self-Help Group, where they are recycled into incense sticks and candles
- Single-use plastic and plastic bags are restricted
- Separate bins for plastic bottles have been installed to recycle and reduce plastic pollution
- The College is connected with the Municipal Corporation Drainage System for management of liquid waste. The wastewater generated from air conditioners is reused for watering the gardens
- Biomedical waste generated from the Bacterial Culture Lab is autoclaved before being disposed of to avoid contamination
- The College has a designated e-waste collection store and an e-waste collection box for periodic disposal of electronic waste from the authorized vendor. Printer cartridges are refilled and reused
- Office automation has largely reduced the use of paper for administrative purposes including maintenance of



records, leave application etc. Internal notices and communications regarding admissions, examination, fees etc. are done through email and messages.

- Bioreactor for horticulture waste has been installed in the Botanical Garden
- A Milk Bag Recycling Bin has been installed in the area behind the canteen to minimize the deleterious impact of empty milk packets
- Student Self Help Groups and Entrepreneurial Venture of the College put up stalls displaying Bio organic manure, made from the compost in Botanical Garden of the College, eco friendly, pens and pencils on different occasion promote sustainable practices

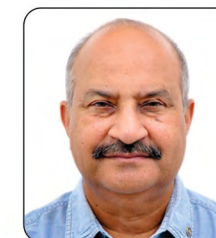

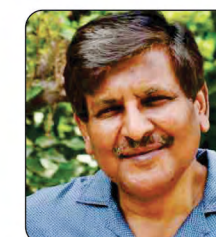

National Educational Policy (NEP-2020)

Curriculum and Credit Framework for UG Programmes under NEP, Panjab University, Chandigarh

The duration of UG Degree (Honours) shall be of 4 years (eight semesters). A student can exit at the end of 3 years (six semesters) and shall be awarded UG Degree. A student can also exit at the end of 2 years (four semesters) shall be awarded UG Diploma. A student can also exit at the end of 1 year (two semesters) and shall be awarded UG Certificate. For obtaining UG Certificate/UG Diploma/UG Degree/ UG Degree (Honours)/ UG Degree (Honours with Research), a student shall qualify the number of credits as per these Regulations and Scheme framed in accordance with these Regulations.

UG Certificate:

The student who opts to exit after completion of the first year and has secured minimum 48 credits shall be awarded a UG certificate provided she/he secures 6 credits from the skill based courses earned during the 1st and 2nd semesters (included in 48 credits) and completes summer internship/vocational/Apprenticeship course of 4 credits during the summer vacations of the first year. The student shall be allowed to resume within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma:

The student who opts to exit after completion of the 2nd year and has secured minimum 96 credits shall be awarded the UG diploma provided she/he secures 4 credits from internship/vocational course during the summer vacations of the 2nd year. The student shall be allowed to resume within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree:

The student opting to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded a UG Degree in the major discipline after a successful completion of 3 years, securing minimum 144 credits including the minimum credit requirements for ability enhancement courses, skill development courses, value added courses, and community engagement/ internship/field based project(s) as given in Table below.

4-year UG Degree (Honours):

A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline shall be awarded to those students who complete a 4-year UG programme successfully with minimum 192 credits including minimum credit requirements for ability enhancement courses, skill development courses, value added courses, and community engagement/internship/ field based project(s) as given in Table below.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):

The students securing 75% marks and above, in the first six semesters of UG programme shall be allowed to choose a research stream at the undergraduate level in the 4th year. She/he shall complete a research project or dissertation in the major discipline under the guidance of an approved faculty member of the University/College. The student securing minimum 192 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation fulfilling minimum credit requirements for ability enhancement courses, skill development courses, value added courses, and community engagement/internship/field-based project(s).

The UG degree programme can be pursued with the following options:

- UG Degree Programmes with Single Major: In the case of students pursuing UG Degree programme with single major, she/he has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of

National Educational Policy (NEP-2020)

credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 60 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a single major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon.with Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with single major.

- UG degree with Double Major- In the case of students pursuing UG Degree programme with double major, she/he has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the 2nd Major discipline for the 3rd/4th year UG degree to be awarded double major. Accordingly, the number of total credits will be higher, which may be determined by the Faculty of Arts/Science/Commerce as the case may be.
- Interdisciplinary UG programme: In the case of students pursuing an interdisciplinary UG programme, the credits for core courses shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects so as to get core competence in the interdisciplinary programme. For example, a degree in Econometrics requires courses in Economics, Statistics, and Mathematics. The total credits to core courses shall be distributed so that the student gets full competence in Econometrics upon completion of the programme. The degree for such students will be awarded as B.Sc. in Econometrics for a 3-year UG programme or B.Sc. (Honours) / B.Sc. (Honours with Research) in Econometrics for a 4-year UG programme.
- Multidisciplinary UG programme: In the case of students pursuing a multidisciplinary UG programme, the credits to core courses will be distributed among the broad disciplines such as Life sciences, Physical Sciences, Mathematical and Computer Sciences, Data Analysis, Social Sciences, Humanities, etc., For example, a student who opts for a UG program in Life sciences will have the total credits to core courses distributed across Botany, Zoology and Human biology disciplines. The degree will be awarded as B.Sc. in Life Sciences for a 3-year programme and B.Sc. (Honours) in Life Sciences or B.Sc. - Candidates having passed +2 exam without English from any recognised body are eligible to join BA/BSc/BCA/BCom/BBA, otherwise, he/she have to pass the deficient English Subject with parent Board/University in two consecutive chances; failing which admission will automatically stand cancelled.
- All Compartment Candidates must fulfil requirements as per regulations under rules and regulations governing admissions.

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

1. The candidates shall be admitted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations contained in the latest Panjab University Calendar/Guidelines/any other instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the University from time to time for the respective courses/examinations and in order of merit.
2. All the admissions to these institutions are provisional and subject to the approval of Panjab University. The institution cannot be held responsible in case the University does not approve the admission of a student on account of giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or false information, attaching incomplete testimonials or choosing wrong combination of subjects or delayed submission of certificates etc. The fine/penalty imposed by Panjab University for any default in this regard shall be the personal responsibility of the student. Claims for refund of fees for cancellation of admission or penalty on this account will not be entertained.
3. All provisionally admitted candidates will have to verify original documents before the Admission Committee as and when required by the College/University Authorities.
4. Any instructions or rules received from the Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University, after the publication of this prospectus, will be binding on the students.
5. Students disqualified by any University/Board shall not be admitted.

Candidates from Open School

Students who have passed 10+2 examination from Open School recognised by Panjab University are eligible for admission to the BA/BSc/BCA/BCom/BBA 1st year and they should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks for the course.

Foreign Students

All Foreign/NRI Students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General), Panjab University in all cases and the admission of the Foreign/NRI students to College would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean, International Students, PU. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same, in original, to College. The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate.

Checklist of Documents for Foreign Students

- a. Original Passport / Visa. (Wherever applicable)
 - b. Valid Student Visa for all Foreign Students and Resident permit for Tibetan Students
 - c. A certificate of registration from the local police after taking the admission in the College

 - f. Academic certificates and testimonials
 - g. Original Letter/s of Scholarship/s in case of those who are Government of India sponsored Scholars
- The College has the right to reject any admission form and refuse admission if there is any discrepancy in the name, date of birth or even spellings of the names in passport, certificates, testimonials and birth certificate etc. of the students.
 - Foreign diplomats will be permitted to pursue studies only after undergoing a change in their visa status, i.e., from diplomat visa to student visa.

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

Compartment Candidates

- a. A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of UG Programmes—BA/BSc/BCom/BBA/BCA (except BSc Biotech Hons) provided he fulfils the following conditions:
 - i. He/She should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
 - ii. He/She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in compartment; and
 - iii. He/She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in aggregate of the examination (subjects) as laid down in the relevant regulations.

Provided that:-

A candidate joining the BSc//BA First Semester should have obtained at least 35% marks /50% in case of BCA/BBA/45% in BCom marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the one consecutive chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the admission, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

Note: The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join UG courses 1st Semester, if they cleared their compartment subject/s in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available.

Such candidates are required to submit the following documents to the office immediately after the declaration of result:

- Original DMC with compartment result
 - Original DMC with PASS result.
- b. Compartment Candidates of +2 Examination seeking admission to first degree level running parallel utility-oriented certificate/Diploma/Advances Diploma and Add-on Courses Programme along with BA/BSc/BCom/BCA/BBA Part-I Course.

With a view to vocationalize the education at first-degree level during Xth plan period, parallel utility-oriented certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma Programs have been introduced. The candidates who are placed in compartment in +2 examination having been admitted provisionally to BA/BSc/BCom Part-I Class shall also be considered to have been admitted provisionally in these courses. The eligibility requirements and Regulations/Rules for certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma Courses sanctioned by the UGC under Career Orientation Programme to various affiliated Colleges from the admissions of 2004 as Add-On Courses for BA/BSc/BCom (Semester System) (1st, 2nd and 3rd) will be same as for admission to BA/BSc/BCom Course (Semester System).
 - c. A student of any other university who is placed under compartment in BA/BSc/ BCA/BCom/BBA Course (I/II/III) is not allowed to join the BA/BSc/ BCom/BBA Course (II/III) or PG Courses of this university.

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

- d. A candidate who is placed under Compartment in one subject in BA III exam of this University shall be allowed to join MA (Semester System) class provisionally if he/she fulfils other requirements, and provided -
 - i. the subject in which he/ she has to re appear is not offered for the MA I year exam.
 - ii. if he/ she fails to clear the Compartment subject of the BA III year exam in the next two consecutive chances immediately following the exam in which he/ she was placed under Compartment, his/her provisional admission to MA I class as also his/ her result of MA I Year (1st and 2nd Semesters) exam shall be cancelled. (Addition of Regulation 12 appearing at page 93 for MA/ MSc exam (Semester System) (Revised) of PU Calendar, Volume II 2007)

Private Candidates

Besides fulfilling eligibility conditions, private candidates are also required to submit an affidavit of good conduct or character certificate from a gazetted officer.

Not Eligible to Join Next Higher Class Even Provisionally

- a. Candidates who have passed examination from University/ Board, equivalence of which has not been approved by the PU Chandigarh. (Please see equivalence booklet 1999, consolidated supplementary list 2004, list of Fake Universities and List of Non-recognised Boards).
- b. Candidates of any other University whose results have been declared as 'Result Late'.
- c. Candidates who have been disqualified by any Board/University.
- d. Candidates placed in compartment/re-appear in more than one subject in 10+2 examinations.
- e. For Ongoing classes, promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester, the candidate with less than 50% of the total papers cleared/passed till that semester.
- f. Compartment Candidates of other Universities.
- g. Candidates who could not acquire 20% marks in the compartment subject in 10+2.

Migration of Candidates

- a. Students from other colleges affiliated to PU may be allowed to migrate (transfer) with the prior permission of the concerned Principals and as per the University rules and regulations. The candidate has to submit a College Leaving Certificate from the previous college along with the other certificates.
- b. Migration Certificate is not required from students of School Boards of Punjab, Haryana, HP and CBSE, Delhi.
- c. The candidates coming from other Universities/ Boards/ Councils/ Bodies are required to provide:
 - i. A migration certificate in original from the Board/University concerned.
 - ii. The lower examination pass certificate, in original.
 - iii. Lecture statement from the College he/she migrates if required.

Admission shall not be granted without submission of the Migration Certificate in original latest by September 10, 2024 or as specified by PU from time to time. Thereafter the requisite document shall be accepted with penalty as per PU Admission Guideline 2024-25

- d. A candidate who has passed his/her 1st Semester and 2nd Semester of BA/BSc (General)/BCom./BBA/BCA Course conducted by another University/College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a college affiliated to this University/ Department of Evening Studies/University School of Open Learning in the 3rd semester/5th semester of

the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV –‘Migration of Students’ Page No.292 to 309 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2019) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject(s) if any, within the permissible chances.

Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to the University (i.e. on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University Rule No.6 given at Page No.310-311 of P.U. Calendar Volume – III, 2019.

- e. Migration fee and eligibility fee shall be charged from every student coming from another University.
- f. No migration shall be allowed in a Postgraduate Course from a college affiliated to another University during second year.
- g. Migration of students from professional college to an Arts/Science college and vice versa is not permissible.
- h. When the migration of the student has been allowed, he must join the new college within 15 days otherwise the migration shall automatically stand cancelled.

Note: The migration shall be allowed only if the applicants are eligible for admission to the course as per PU admission regulations.

Late Admission

- a. Permission of the Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University is necessary for admission after the expiry of the last date for admission given with the Principal’s permission.
- b. A student whose result of +2 examination in February/March conducted by a School Board is published late in the year of admission he/she may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result, and his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to an Open School Board also. (See Rule 10 at Page No. 363 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2019).
- c. In the case of Panjab University students who have already appeared in any of its examination and the result is declared late for one or the other reason, the admission cannot be said to be a case of fresh admission. They are already midway of the class. In these cases, admissions to the next class/course may be allowed within 10 working days, from the date of dispatch of result, without charging any late fee.

Cancellation of Admission and Readmission

Admission of all such candidates who fail to attend at least 33% of the total lectures delivered and practical held in all papers during the first 10 days (from start of teaching work) in the concerned course without sanctioned leave will be cancelled as per following:

- a. List of candidates whose admission is cancelled will be put on notice board.
- b. The candidates have to give in writing the reason for non-attendance.
- c. If a student’s name is struck off from the college rolls, he/she will be required to seek readmission within 10 working days failing which his/her admission will stand cancelled.
- d. Re-admission will be done subject of availability of seats and fee of Rs 1,500/- will be charged
- e. Re-admission is not the right of every student. It is the prerogative of the Principal of the College.
- f. The attendance of the student seeking re-admission will however be counted from the first day of teaching and not from the date of re-admission.
- g. It is mandatory for the student to bring his/her parents at the time of re-admission.
- h. All vacated seats will be filled from the waiting list.

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

Rules for Withdrawal

- a. Students leaving the College must inform the Principal in writing on prescribed WITHDRAWAL FORM (available online). He/ She must submit withdrawal form along with a copy of fee slip duly signed by him/her and his/her parents/authorised guardian and counter signed by the respective Admission Convenor. Until a student's name is formally withdrawn, he is liable to pay all College dues and fines levied.
- b. No certificate/no refund of fees is permissible to those leaving the College without permission.
- c. No Certificate of any kind shall be issued to students unless the arrears of fine, Hostel or College dues or fine of library books are cleared.

Refund of Fees

- a. Refund of Fees will be processed as per UGC/ PU Guidelines/DHE Chandigarh norms.
- b. Refund form will be available online in login portal student.sggscollege.ac.in

Deficient Subjects

Deficient subject is one which is not passed by the candidate in the previous institution in that class and is required to be qualified for admission to the next higher class.

- a. A Candidate seeking admission to the College after migration from Universities other than the Panjab University shall clear deficient subjects, if any.
- b. Deficiencies shall be determined by the Principal/ Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to University (i.e. on the registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University rule No 6 given at Page 310-11 of PU Calendar, Vol III, 2019.
- c. The candidate should be asked to furnish the details of the courses he/she has covered in his/her previous institution, i.e., course contents etc. And that should be certified by the Principal/ Competent Authority of the previous institution.
- d. In case of students who have passed their BA/BSc/Bom/BCA/BBA part I/II examination from Universities other than those from the Punjab State there should be no deficient subjects.
- e. In case the student had covered more than 50% of the syllabus prescribed by the PU in a subject it shall not be treated to be a deficient subject.

Provision for Non-Affiliated Subject

Regular Candidates of BA/BSc/BCom/BCA/BBA of affiliated colleges may be allowed to pursue a subject of interest respectively for BA/BSc/BCom/BBA (Pass/ Honours) Courses, in which his/her college is not affiliated, by attending the prescribed course of instruction in that subject in another college affiliated for it, in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 25 appearing at page 54 of Panjab University Calendar Vol II, 2000 (previously page 55 of Panjab University Calendar Vol II, 1955) by paying the requisite fee at other College with prior permission of the Principal.

Reservation of Seats & Weightage

Reservation of seats in different categories will be made as per instructions issued by PU /UT Administration from time to time. Supernumerary Seats are additional Seats over and above the approved Seats per Unit of the courses as per regulations and are not de-reserved in any case. Students can apply for more than one reserve category, but can get benefits in only one category of his/her choice. The reservation of seats shall be governed

by the Policy of Union Territory of Chandigarh as per Letter 19/1/93/IH (3)5311, dated March 18, 1999, issued by Home Secretary, UT; letter vide Home Dept, Chd Administration order no 19/1/3-IH (3)-2008/20352 dated Oct 27, 2008 for Defence; The rights of persons with Disabilities Act, 2016]; For details, visit www.dhe.chd.gov.in

A) The reservation of seats for Students belonging to **Scheduled Castes/ Tribes** shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at page 168 in Panjab University Calendar Volume-I, 2005 and intimation/s received from DPI (Colleges):

Students of SC/ST and BC shall be allowed a concession of 5% marks for admission to the courses in which a certain percentage of minimum marks has been prescribed provided they have obtained minimum pass marks as prescribed by regulations. (PU Calendar Vol. I, Page 168, Regulation 29.1 (IT))

B) Reservations for the **Physically Challenged** 5% marks concession shall be given to Physically handicapped persons in the minimum eligibility criteria for a course subject to minimum permanent disability of 40% provided they have obtained minimum pass marks. Students with a temporary disability will not be considered against the reserved seats for the physically challenged. Where the certificate is issued by any authority other than the Principal Medical Officer of Chandigarh, the concerned Head of the institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmation from the PMO, Chandigarh.

C) Wards of **Freedom Fighters** as per University rules:

2% seats in each pool will be filled from the category of children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters. A certificate issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district will have to be attached with the admission form

D) Reservation of **Dependents of Defence/ Paramilitary Personnel** etc will be followed as per Panjab University letter no 7751-7780/ Misc/ A-6 dated Aug 14, 2003 and the circular issued by the GOI, Ministry of Home Affairs, no 27011/9/98-PF-I dated May 26, 1998.

E) Reservation for **Sports**: 2% Seats in each course are reserved for Sports Persons.

Guidelines for admission to this category will be as per rules and regulations of Sports Department of the Chandigarh Administration vide Home Secretary letter no. 8493 dated May 5, 2003.

Foreign Nationals/NRI Candidates: 10% over and above the total number of regular seats in each course is reserved for Foreign Nationals/ NRI candidates.

F) Wards of **Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu Families** (Non- Migrants living in Kashmiri Valley)

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

- Relaxation in cut-off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirements.
- Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise.
- Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
- Waiving off domicile requirements. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.

G) Wards of Martyrs/Permanent Disabled of Kargil War :

Concession be given for admission to various courses in Educational Institutions for those wards of martyrs/ permanent disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil war who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this effect and the same be entered in the Pension Book of the family:

- 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated Colleges; (except in partially financed/self-financing courses.)
- Exemption in fee
- Exemption in hostel fee. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

H) Additional seats for **One Girl Child** out of only Two Girl Children and patients of Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia.

- Two additional seats, per unit, per course, for a Single Girl Child or One Girl Child out of only Two Girl Children, subject to maximum limit of four.
- One additional seat each for the student suffers from **Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia**:
As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

I) Victims of 1984 riots of Punjab:

- Free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State. {Approved vide Syndicate Para 5 (Statement 'A') dated 25.04.1987}.
- That grand-sons and grand-daughters be excluded from the provision made in Syndicate decision dated 18.10.2015, with regard to admission for sons/grandsons/daughters/grand-daughters/husband/wife/brothers/sisters of persons killed/incapacitated in November, 1984 riot and of persons killed/incapacitated in terrorist violence in Punjab & Chandigarh w.e.f. the Session 2018-19. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

J) Additional seats for **Border area and Rural area** students

- Two seats for the candidates belonging to rural areas should have passed the 10th and 12th class examination from the rural area to become eligible for additional seats meant for rural area students.
- One seat for the candidates belonging to border areas should have passed the 10th class examination from a school situated in border area and the 12th from a school situated in any other area to become eligible for additional seats meant for border area student. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

K) One Additional seat for **Transgender Students**

One additional seat be created for the transgender students from the session 2024-25 onwards in each course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Panjab University Regional Centres, Panjab University Constituent Colleges and the Colleges affiliated to the University, subject to the following eligibility conditions, provided the concerned Regulatory Body Permits.

- The candidate seeking admission is otherwise eligible as per Panjab University Rules.
- The claimant candidate will have to submit a validated Transgender Certificate from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment or Certificate of Identity as well as Identity Card issued by the District Magistrate as per the prescribed format given under 'The Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Rules, 2020 read with the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019. As per Circular No. Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024. (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

- L) **Blind students:** The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he/she will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-I dated 18.04.2009)

M) **Weightage & Reservation for excellence in Youth Festival**

- One additional seat per unit will be reserved for those candidates who have excelled and outperformed in the Youth Festivals.
- The candidates availing the aforesaid weightage must fulfil the eligibility condition for admission to the particular course.
- Admission criterion will be fixed on the basis of merit as mentioned below and upon the verification of the original certificates of those candidates, who:
 - have presented an item in an international cultural festival approved by Punjab Govt./Govt. of India/Punjab University.
 - have got distinction in All India National Inter University Youth Festival organised by AIU/ Govt. of India.
 - have got distinction in North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organised by AIU.
 - have secured First/Second/Third position in the Inter University Youth Festival organised by Govt. of Punjab/ any State or Central University.
 - have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Inter Zonal Festival.
 - have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Zonal Festival.
 - have secured First/Second/Third position in state level competition of State School Education Board of Punjab/ Haryana/HP/or CBSE/ICSE or any other recognized board.
 - Category A is considered as a higher category followed by B, C....onwards.
 - Preference will be given to the candidate/s who have represented Panjab University, Chandigarh in A, B, C or D category.

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

- In case of two or more candidates having equal position at equal level: Position secured in an individual item shall be rated higher than position secured as a team member. The eligibility of the candidate for participation in University Youth Festivals, in future, may also be considered. Academic record will be considered in case of tie between two or more candidates.

- In case of any ambiguity, the related certificates shall be verified from the Department of Youth Welfare, Panjab University through the concerned Chairperson/Principal/Head etc.
- The candidate/s admitted shall have to participate in the activities associated with his/her item. The admission committee will assess the participation of the candidate and in case the candidate does not fulfil the requirements, his admission may be cancelled. However, exemption may be given because of special reasons like sickness or any other unavoidable reason.

N) **Weightage for Participation in Extra Curricular Activities**

As per letter no 49411-49601 dated Jun 25, 2014 from the Deputy Registrar PU Chd:

- National Cadet Corps (NCC):** The holders of NCC Certificates A, B and C shall be given the weightage in marks in the following manner – Certificate A: 1%, Certificate B: 2%, Certificate C: 3%
- National Service Scheme (NSS):** As per syndicate para 13 (22.1.2014) and 36 (25.01.2015), NSS Volunteers will be given weightage in marks as follows- Certificate A: 1%, Certificate B: 2%, Certificate C: 3%
- Zonal/ Inter-Zonal / Inter-University Youth Festival:**

d. **Youth Welfare Activities**

Participation in Advanced Youth Leadership Training Camp/Youth Leadership Training Camp/ Advanced Mountaineering/Hiking/Trekking/Mountaineering [1% marks per camp per year (minimum 5 days camp) up to maximum of 3% marks (maximum of 3 camps)]

Note: A candidate can claim weightage in one or more categories (i-iv) given above. The total weightage should not exceed 9% of the normalized marks obtained in qualifying examination.

These weightages shall not be used for determining eligibility for admission as prescribed by the University under its regulation.

Note: Additional seats may also be created, if needed, for ICCR scholars on Government of India Scholarships.

Semester Promotion Rules and Reappear Regulations

- A candidate who is admitted to the 1st/3rd/5th semester of UG Classes will be allowed to be promoted to 2nd/4th/6th semester respectively. However, for promotion from 2nd to 3rd or from 4th to 5th semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50%, fractions like 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.
- A candidate shall be considered to pass in exam if he/she obtains 35% marks in each paper.

Rules and Regulations Governing Admissions

3. Candidates have to obtain pass marks in each course of theory and practical separately for each semester.
 - a. If a student has failed to qualify at least 50% papers in a semester he/ she shall leave the course. However, the student can appear in the next exam as a late college student without attending the classes but the original internal assessment shall remain the same. After qualifying the semester, he/ she can resume studies.
 - b. If taking into account all the semesters together up to 6th semester, the number of papers in which a student has failed exceeds 50%, he/ she shall leave the course. However, he/she can appear in the semesters in which he/ she failed as a late college student without attending the classes but the original internal assessment shall be retained. The student can resume the study but must complete the course in 6 years.
 - c. 6th semester results shall be notified only after the student has cleared all the papers. For other purposes, the marks will be made available provisionally.
4. A candidate who fails in any semester & is not covered under the Re-appear Regulation may be given one more chance to appear at the next exam without attending a fresh course of lectures but will have to repeat the entire exams. If a candidate fails to pass any semester exam even after repeating the entire exam, he/ she will be required to leave the course.
5. The Syndicate may extend this period, for a member of the regular armed forces, who is unable to complete the course owing to defence exigencies.
6. A candidate who appears in the reappear subject at the odd with odd, even with even exam under this Regulation shall have to bear exam fee as per University rules and will not be eligible for scholarship.
7. A candidate, who has passed second semester or any subsequent semester exam, discontinues his studies, may be permitted to join the next semester within 2 years of his passing the qualifying semester exam. If a candidate has completed the 1st semester in a college and cannot get admission in the 2nd semester due to some reason, he/ she should be given admission in the 2nd semester next year with the condition that he/ she must have attended the classes and appeared in examination in the college for the 1st semester. A few admission dates may also be allotted in January, i.e., one week after the winter break as per PU Academic Calendar, 2016-17. (As per Syndicate Para 49 Dated 01-05-2016).
8. The candidates shall be admitted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations contained in the latest Panjab University calendar/guidelines/any other instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the University from time to time for the respective courses/examinations and in order of merit.
9. Admission of students to the institution is provisional and subject to the approval of Panjab University. The institution cannot be held responsible in case the University does not approve the admission of a student on account of giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or false information, attaching incomplete testimonials or choosing wrong combination of subjects or delayed submission of certificates etc. The fine/penalty imposed by Panjab University for any default in this regard shall be the personal responsibility of the student. Claims for refund of fees for cancellation of admission or penalty on this account will not be entertained.
10. Any instructions or rules received from the Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University, after the publication of this prospectus, will be binding on the students.
11. Students disqualified by any University/Board not recognised by PU, Chd shall not be admitted.
12. Environment, Road Safety Education and Violence against Women & Children and Drug is a compulsory paper, which the candidates are required to pass with at least 33% marks either in the 1st/ 2nd/ 3rd Year of the Course, failing which the Degree will not be issued.

Code of Conduct for Students

- Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and exhibit dignified behaviour.
- They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and uphold the discipline and esteem of the College.
- Students must attend their classes regularly and carry their ID cards along.
- Students must read the Notice Board and check the College Website regularly.
- Keep the campus clean and plastic free.
- Fans, lights and other electrical equipment must be switched off while leaving the labs and classrooms.
- Consumption of intoxicants in any form is strictly prohibited in the College and Hostel premises.
- Students are expected to carefully handle the College property. Sticking posters and advertisements or scribbling on walls and furniture is strictly prohibited.
- Students are not allowed to invite outsiders to the College campus or Hostel premises, except their parents or authorised guardians.
- Use of mobile phones should be avoided.
- Students are expected to make optimal use of the Library and other academic, co-curricular facilities of the College in their free time.
- Students must be appropriately dressed and adhere to the cultural values and ethos of the College.
- Ragging, bullying, physical/verbal/sexual abuse or misbehaviour with fellow students or College staff is strictly prohibited and will be treated as criminal offence.
- Students who do not follow the code of conduct are liable to be penalised/suspended/ expelled from the College as per the decision of the authorities.

Decision of the Principal shall be final and binding

Mid Semester Examinations Rules

- College will conduct one mandatory Mid Semester Test in each semester.
- The Internal Assessment of students will be based on these Mid Semester Tests as per PU guidelines.
- Absence from these examinations on any ground will be treated as failure with nil marks.
- Students absenting themselves from the Mid Semester Tests without leave will be fined as per rules.
- Use of Mobile Phones is banned during exams and a fine of Rs 500/- will be imposed, if found guilty.

PU Examination Rules

Eligibility to appear in University Exams

- The students are required to attend 75% of lectures, and practicals (if applicable) held for the class in each subject offered (to be counted from last date of admission till the start of preparatory holidays.)
- A student has to obtain 25% marks in the aggregate of all subjects in the Mid Semester Tests.
- A student has to obtain minimum marks as per PU Chandigarh rules in discretionary test, if held.
- The onus of timely submission of University Examination Form along with the required examination fee with the college office shall be on the student.

College Leave Rules

- Students should apply for leave on the prescribed form. Leave approval up to 10 days by the Principal.
- Names of students remaining absent for 06 consecutive days, without prior permission will be struck off from the College. Rs 1500/- shall be charged for re-admission.
